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# THE ROAD TO Reconciliation

### CONGRESS PASSES A BUDGET RESOLUTION

This resolution instructs specific House and Senate committees to write parts of the reconciliation bill and tells each committee how much to change spending or revenue.

### COMMITTEES WRITE RECONCILIATION BILLS

The instructions in the budget resolution dictate which committees can contribute to the reconciliation effort and what the committees may produce.

### COMMITTEES MARK UP THEIR BILLS

At this point, committee members may offer amendments modifying i.e., "marking up"—the legislation.

### THE COMMITTEES' BILLS ARE COMBINED Into a single reconciliation package

That bill can now come before the House and Senate for a vote—but their processes for reaching that vote are quite different.

### DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THE HOUSE AND SENATE BILLS ARE RECONCILED

The House and Senate must approve the same version of the reconciliation bill.

### THE PRESIDENT SIGNS THE BILL INTO LAW

Once the House and Senate pass the same version of the reconciliation bill, the final bill goes to the President to sign into law or veto, just like any other bill.

# **\$715 Billion in Cuts to Medicaid and the ACA Single Larges Cut in History**

5 Ways the Republican House Bill Takes Away Health Coverage & Raises Costs



Takes away Medicaid coverage from people not meeting a work requirement



Adds barriers to eligibility and enrollment processes in Medicaid and ACA marketplaces



Adds new out-of-pocket costs for many Medicaid and ACA marketplace enrollees



Fails to stop premium spikes for ACA marketplace enrollees

### Result


Roughly 15 million people become uninsured by 2034, with millions more facing higher premiums and out-of-pocket costs, and more red tape that makes it harder to keep coverage.

10-year federal spending cuts, by policy




# Who Gets Hurt?



# **Child Tax Credit**


The Child Tax Credit will temporarily increase to \$2,500 per child for four years.

- Millions of children whose parents earn too little will be denied this benefit.
- **4.5 Million** U.S. Citizen kids will lose access entirely under new requirement.
  - All filing parents must have a Social Security Number.
- This is cost **\$790 Billion** over the next decade.

# **Immigration Provisions**

What's in the Big Bad Bill?

- Funding for immigration enforcement; expansion of immigration fees; and severe exclusions to vital programs for certain immigrants.
- The total is \$150 billion for immigration and border enforcement over ten years; split across three titles
  - Homeland Security
  - o Judiciary
  - Armed Services
- Increases in spending to these areas make up \$230 billion of the \$2.8 trillion 10-year price tag, according to Penn-Wharton estimates.



# **Immigration Enforcement**

## ICE arrests are climbing—with more funding, they threaten to tear more families apart.

- On May 23, ICE reported making 1,600 arrests; but that could soon be tripled.
- To deport **1 million** people annually, the reconciliation bill provides billions for interior enforcement over 10 years. This is a long-term operation.
  - o \$45 billion to maintain 100k detention beds for adults and families
  - \$14.4 billion for deportations
  - \$8 billion for 10,000 new ICE personnel/investigators
  - \$1.32 billion for government prosecutors
  - \$950 million for state reimbursements for jailing immigrants with criminal convictions as well as those with civil violations
  - o \$650 million to facilitate 287(g) agreements
- Care for unaccompanied children includes \$100 million for repatriation.




# **Immigration Enforcement**

### Increasing militarization at the border is deadly and expensive.

- The bill provides
  - \$46.5 billion for approximately 2,300 miles of new and replacement border wall and barriers
  - $\circ$  \$12 billion for state border security reimbursements
  - $\circ$  \$4.1 billion for 8,490 border agents and officers
  - $_{\odot}$  \$5 billion for DOD operations and detention

# **Health Exclusions & Restrictions**

The rules surrounding income and immigration eligibility for federal health insurance coverage are **complex**; and in general non-citizens, even lawfully present immigrants, report low participation rates because of fear of immigration implications.

- Specifically, the bill:
  - Ends ACA marketplace coverage eligibility for DACA recipients
  - Ends ACA marketplace coverage eligibility for many lawfully present immigrants that are currently eligible.
  - Ends Medicare eligibility for many lawfully present immigrants, except for green card holders and few specific groups.

As of 2023, **half (50%)** of likely undocumented immigrant adults and **one in five (18%)** lawfully present immigrant adults reported being uninsured compared to less than one in ten naturalized citizen (6%) and U.S.-born citizen (8%) adults (Kaiser Family Foundation)


