



Host a See. Love. Vote. Postcard Party

By gathering with friends, family, and neighbors to write postcards, justice-seekers can connect with voters of faith to share what we are seeing in our communities, how we are responding with love, and why we are voting in the 2026 midterm elections.



This kit is your starting point to host a postcard party! Your kit includes postcards, six stamps to get you started, pens, stickers, a sample message for your postcards, an address list, and a nonpartisan pledge.

Are you ready to host your party? Here's how to get started!

1. Choose a date for your postcard party between August 5, 2026, and October 11, 2026. (After that, it may be cutting it close to the election.)
2. Consider your setup. Are you gathering folks in your home, a library, a church, a school, or somewhere else? Reserve your space if needed.
3. Next, invite friends, family, and community members to your party. You can use our template flyer (scan the QR code at right or visit canva.link/qjouwlk4fp2nbcn) or simply text, call or email folks. If the space allows it, consider inviting guests to bring a dish or beverages to share.





4. As host, you will provide:

- Pens for everyone who will attend.
- Stamps. The cost of a postcard stamp is 65¢. You will receive six stamps from NETWORK and are responsible for any additional stamps needed to mail the postcards from the party.

5. At the beginning of the event, introduce your guests to the See. Love. Vote. campaign:

"See. Love. Vote." is a nonpartisan campaign rooted in the Catholic Social Justice tradition to get out the vote in the 2026 elections! Led by NETWORK Advocates (a 501(c)(3) organization) and more than 55 faith partners across the country, we are connecting communities with the tools they need to be informed and engaged voters, inspired by the common good. Our shared message is: People of faith love our neighbors by voting.

6. As the host, you must sign the nonpartisan pledge and read it to your guests. Ask for a show of hands to affirm commitment to the pledge.
7. Pass out the address list and offer the sample message as guidance for postcard writers. Encourage writers to think about what they are seeing in their communities, how they are responding with love, and why they are voting.
8. Gather the postcards at the end of your event and mail them. **The deadline to mail the postcards is October 12.**
