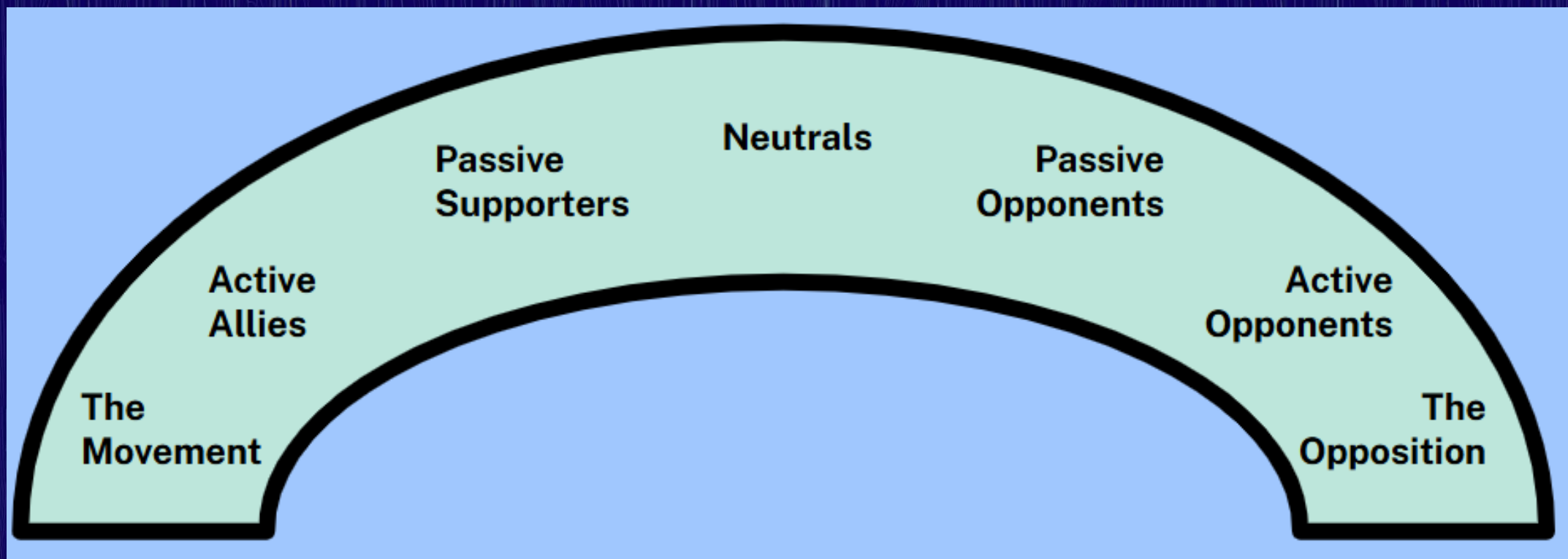

Belonging Before Belief

- Prioritizing a sense of community and belonging



- Nearly 1/2 of movement frontline activists were not issue-aligned when they attended their first event.



- Behave → Belong → Believe



One-on-Ones



- Intentional: clear expectations from the start
- Structured
- No more than 45 minutes
- 70% listening
- Build or deepen a relationship for a purpose



The Basic Formula



- Get to know someone
- Learn what they care about
- Ask questions that help THEM develop clarity
- Provide clear and specific opportunities to engage
- Get a commitment
- Gather more information
- Thank them



Follow Up to Build Power

- **Have a team debrief** *already scheduled*
- **1:1s:** Take time with your team to identify people who engaged in the action who you believe have potential to get more involved. Set up 1:1s with them! Invite them to another meeting or a debrief of the action.
- **Follow up Email:** Plan ahead to make sure you send a follow up email to everyone who filled out the sign-in sheet with a clear next steps invitation or ask.





Follow Up to Build Power



- **Have a clear follow up event or invitation** for new leaders
- **Individual follow up:** Make individual follow up calls and emails to people who made commitments. People will take the commitment seriously if you do.
- **Follow up with key leaders.** A pastor or principal may be more engaged once they see work concretized and have clearer ideas about who else to invite into the work.
